Braille Is Beautiful

This innovative program teaches sighted students how to read and write the Braille alphabet code and increases students' sensitivity to and understanding of blind persons. The program targets grades four through six. However, it can also be used effectively with younger or older children and in community youth programs as well as in the classroom.

Teacher's Guide Economy Kit: \$40 plus s/h

Includes the 100-page *Teacher's Guide* in a loose-leaf binder, 100 Braille alphabet cards, three paperback books with stories by and about ordinary blind people, master copy of the student instruction book and workbook, and one slate and stylus for writing (embossing) Braille dots. The *Teacher's Guide* is structured in five units with a variety of learning formats, including group discussions, interactive games, and applied projects. Parts of the program can be used together or alone.



Media Kit: \$50 plus s/h

Includes two videos, *Jake and the Secret Code* for children and *That The Blind May Read* for adults, a 30-page video discussion guide and resource list with instructions on how to demonstrate writing Braille, a slate and stylus, and a Braille alphabet card.

Combo Set Kit: \$75 plus s/h

Includes a *Teacher's Guide* Economy Kit and a Media Kit.

Curriculum Program Kit: \$250 plus s/h

This program has all the materials needed to instruct a typical classroom of children. Includes a *Teacher's Guide*, *Service Guide*, *The Slate Book* (instruction manual), a Media Kit, 100 Braille alphabet cards, 25 sets of the student instruction book and student workbook, a ream of Braille paper, 5 plastic adhesive labeling sheets, 25 slates and styli, and 25 copies each of *The World Under My Fingers*, *What Color Is The Sun?*, and *I Can Feel Blue on Monday*.
